

Plate Marble Maze

Objective: To design and create a marble maze using a paper plate and craft materials, fostering creativity, problem-solving, and fine motor skills.

Materials Needed:

- 1. Paper plates (one per student)
- 2. Craft sticks
- 3. Hot glue gun (adult supervision required)
- 4. Scissors
- 5. Markers or crayons
- 6. Small marble or ball bearing
- Optional: Pipe cleaners, small plastic cups, pom-poms, stickers, or other decorative materials

Instructions:


- Design Phase: Begin by discussing the concept of a maze with the students. Show examples of different maze designs and discuss the elements of a maze, such as pathways, dead ends, and exits. Encourage students to think about how they want to design their own maze on the paper plate.
- 2. Creating the Maze: Give each

- student a paper plate and instruct them to use craft sticks to create the walls and pathways of their maze on the surface of the plate. They can cut the craft sticks to size using scissors and glue them onto the plate using a hot glue gun (adult supervision required). Encourage students to be creative with their designs, making twists, turns, and obstacles for the marble to navigate through.
- 3. **Decorating:** Once the basic maze structure is complete, students can use markers, crayons, stickers, or other decorative materials to add color and personality to their mazes. They can also use additional craft materials such as pipe cleaners, plastic cups, or pom-poms to create interactive elements within the maze, such as tunnels or obstacles.
- 4. **Testing:** After completing their mazes, give each student a small marble or ball bearing to test their creation. Encourage them to tilt and tip the paper plate to navigate the marble through the maze, using their fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination to guide it towards the exit.

- 5. Challenge and Iterate: Encourage students to challenge themselves by timing how quickly they can navigate the marble through their maze, or by setting goals for completing the maze with fewer mistakes. They can also experiment with modifying their maze designs to make them more challenging or to create new pathways and obstacles.
- 6. **Sharing and Reflection:** Once everyone has had a chance to test their mazes, invite students to share their creations with their classmates and discuss what they enjoyed about the project. Encourage them to reflect on the design process and any challenges they encountered, fostering a sense of teamwork and collaboration.

This project provides young students with an opportunity to explore basic engineering concepts while exercising their creativity and problem-solving skills in a playful and hands-on way. Enjoy watching their imaginations come to life as they design and navigate their own paper plate marble mazes!


